Simply Amazing Baravelle Spirals Half-Day Workshop with RaNae Merrill



In this workshop, you will learn how to draw, color and sew a Baravelle spiral block, based on the techniques in RaNae's book Simply Amazing Spiral Quilts. (Books will be available for purchase at the workshop, but are not required. To purchase a book in advance, go to www.ranaemerrillquilts.com and click on "STORE".) There will be time in class to finish at least one Baravelle spiral block, and you will receive a pattern to finish a single block(s) into a hot pad (single block). Of course, you're welcome to keep making more to create a whole quilt!

About Translucent Foundation Material:

Spirals are sewn using paper piecing, so they require a foundation material to which you sew the fabric. I insist on foundation material that is *translucent*, which means you can see through it. Since you can see through it, you put fabric on the *front* and sew from the *back*. This means that you don't have to think in mirror-image like you have to do on an opaque foundation. (Traditional paper-piecers take note!) My favorite is EQ Printables Foundation Sheets.

For this workshop, foundations will be provided for you, preprinted on EQ Printables Foundation Sheets. If you wish to purchase more, it will be available in class. Most quilt shops also have some version of it and you can purchase it through my online store at www.ranaemerrillquilts.com.
